Eligibility to be a Hualapai Member: To be enrolled you must be 1/4 or more Hualapai blood quantum.

Tribal Enrollment is important for our tribe. It requires proof of descent, blood degree and residency must be looked into with care. Upon receipt of application for enrollment, research family history to insure blood quantum. Schedule a meeting with the tribal enrollment committee to review all applications to recommend for approval to the tribal council for enrollment. After reviewing applications by the enrollment committee, a resolution is prepared for tribal council approval. All records are of confidential nature, filed and maintained in cabinets only used the enrolment coordinator. Maintain death reports and relinquishments. Prepare all tribal ID cards and certification of degree of Indian blood, making sure of proper signature of individual and tribal chairmen.

On April 3, 1971 the Hualapai Tribe accepted the Hualapai Membership Roll with Resolution No. 13-71. If you don't have a Tribal Identification card, you may come get one, first time, is FREE. If you have lost your card, or have had it stolen, it cracked in half or you washed your card and the writing or picture is peeling off or you want to up date your picture. YOU MUST PAY \$10.00 TO REPLACE YOUR CARD.

Rental assistance is based on financial need and is limited per available funding on a first-come first serve basis.

Summer Youth Program– Between the period of May though August we employ summer youth employees between the ages of 14-18 to gain work experience.

SERVICES OFFERED:

Maintenance– We offer maintenance repairs for our Low Rental and Homeownership units for income eligible tenants. Homeownership resident must pay for maintenance repairs before the work is done. Per HUD and NAHASDA Guidelines we do not assist privately owned homes.
