Services Provided: The Emergency Services is comprised of 4 programs, Fire, EMS, Animal Control & Bio Terrorism Programs; The Fire Department has an existing Emergency Response Team who provides assistance to the community members for unforeseen severe weather situations, such as extreme cold or heat, long term power outages or any natural or manmade disasters. We also perform fire and safety inspections of all businesses in the local area, upon request, the department can inspect private homes for fire and safety hazards. We assist with Search & Rescue for Tribal and Non-Tribal members within the boundaries of the Reservation, as well as assisting neighboring Havasupai Tribe for their natural disasters.

Behavior Program: HJDRC requires that all youth maintain appropriate behavior. This is part of the level system which gives them special privileges.

Green Re-entry Program: Helps transition the youth back into the community in collaboration with other agencies to ensure support system is implemented and/or continued once the youth is released from our facility.

Programming: Volunteers from community that hold positive group classes weekly for youth on different subjects.

Visitation: Parent(s) and legal guardian(s) are encourage to come and visit their loved ones while they are detained at HJDRC. **Visitation Hours: Saturday Mornings at 10:00 am—11:30 am and 3:00 pm– 4:30 pm** Parent or legal guardian must call and schedule the time before they can come into detention. No Outside items (food, pictures, cell phones, keys, etc.) are allowed into the facility. There are secure lockers in the lobby area. Visitation can be extended if the youth parent/ legal guardian lives more than 60 miles away and there is enough staff to accommodate the visit. Visitors must be properly dressed at all times and have some type of ID to prove who they are. **All visitors must be in a sober condition and or not have any odor of alcohol on them.**

Telephone Calls/ Mail: Youth can make phone calls to parent(s)/legal guardian(s) on Tuesday or Saturday. They youth receive mail Monday-Friday, and send unlimited letters.

We are also committed to enhancing and facilitate communication and coordination to collaboratively engage integral federal agencies and tribal programs to impact crime and recidivism for the good of all community residents and visitors.

Services Provided by Program:

All adult criminal cases and juvenile delinquency cases investigated and reported by Hualapai Police Dept. are reviewed for court filing by the Hualapai Prosecutor's office. All traffic citations issued by Hualapai Police department are filed through the Prosecutor's office. All child(ren) protection cases referred from Social Services and Police Dept. are reviewed for court filing by the Prosecutor's office. The Prosecutor's office also reviews and advises other tribal enforcement dept. as deemed necessary or appropriate. In coordination with Hualapai Probation office the prosecutor's office adjudicated violation of sentencing or disposition orders. The office furthermore handles special civil actions related to fugitive warrants and civil seizures in drug related crimes.

The Hualapai Prosecutor's office works collaboratively with the Hualapai Police Departments, U.S. Attorney's office and it's Federal agents, Hualapai Human Services Program, Hualapai Behavioral Health Department, the Hualapai Tribal Court and Probation Department, and Hualapai Public Defender's Office.

In the spirit of collaboration the office participates as member of the Child Protection Team, Multi Disciplinary Team, Justice Complex Development Committee Hualapai Justice system advisory board and other committees as time allows.
