





Peach Springs Unified School District # 8

Override Election – November 05, 2013

The School District is asking the voters to approve a budget override to increase the school's budget limit by fourteen (14) % for a period of five years, 10% for the sixth year, and 5% for the seventh year. The years are School Year 2014-15 and the next six years.

This override would replace an existing override that was already approved by the voters five (5) years ago.

The approval of the budget override election would allow the school to continue existing programs,

- Maintaining reasonable class sizes
- Re-establish full-day kindergarten (The State only funds ½ day kindergarten)
- Maintaining special area classes such as Art, Physical Education and Computer Integrated instruction for PARCC Assessment readiness

The budget increase, if voter approved, would be entirely funded by a levy of taxes only on the taxable property located within the school district.

Housing Improvement Program (HIP) Applications

The Housing Improvement Program is a home repair, renovation and replacement grant program administered by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and federally-recognized Indian Tribes for American Indians and Alaska Native individuals and families who have no immediate resource for standard housing. To be eligible for HIP assistance, you must be a member of a federally recognized American Indian tribe or be an Alaska Native; live in an approved tribal service area; have an income that does not exceed 125% of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines; have present housing that is substandard, as defined in the regulations 25 CFR, Part 256; have no other resource for housing assistance; have not received HIP assistance after October 1, 1986 for repairs, renovation, replacement or housing, or down payment assistance; and have not acquired your present housing through a federally sponsored housing program that includes such housing assistance. Interested applicants should contact Michelle Zephier at the Hualapai Planning Dept. for an Application Package containing the application, guidelines, and required supporting documentation necessary in order to qualify for eligibility. Complete applications and all supporting documentation **are due by November 29, 2013. No exceptions.**

Accessibility Improvements to Ten Public Buildings in Peach Springs



In 2012, the Hualapai Tribe was awarded an Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) for \$412,500 to remodel existing entrances at ten public buildings in Peach Springs to meet the modern standards of the American's with Disabilities Act (ADA). The project has been designed by Stroh Architecture of Prescott and the construction contract was awarded to Big Red Construction of Kingman this summer. The work will consist of removing the front doors and replacing them with push button or motion sensor activated door openers. The Gym, Senior Center and Best Market will be receiving additional work in the form of level and hard-surfaced parking spaces, covered entryways and lighting improvements. Construction has begun with the demolition of the breezeway between the Best Market and the Planning Office on October 15th. Work is scheduled to continue until the end of the year, with completion of the project in early 2014. Below is a construction schedule listing the ten buildings and their construction time frames.

Public Notice for BIA Truxton Cañon Agency

BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS
TRUXTON CAÑON AGENCY
FUELS MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The Bureau of Indian Affairs, Truxton Cañon Agency will be conducting the C-5 and C-8 Prescribed Burn in the Hualapai Tribal Forest once weather and environmental conditions are suitable to conduct the burn. The C-5 and C-8 burn is located on the northeast portion of the Hualapai Reservation in the Hualapai Forest, approximately 24 miles northeast of Peach Springs and 2 miles northwest of the Frazier Wells Road and Route 18 intersection.

The purpose of the burn is to reduce the hazardous fuel accumulation in Ponderosa pine stands, improve forage for wildlife and livestock and to return fire to a fire adapted ecosystem. The burn will also reduce the potential of catastrophic and damaging wildfires for several years after the burn.

In the interest of public safety, roads accessing the C-5 and C-8 burn may be closed at times and will remain closed until the roadways are safe for public travel. Smoke plumes will be visible from Peach Springs and the surrounding area. Smoke may be present and possibly heavy at times on Route 18 and other area road-

ways. Motorists are asked to please slow down and use caution if smoke is encountered. The duration of heavy smoke should end shortly after the burn is completed. However, light smoke may be visible for up to 3 weeks after the burn.

The new schedule will cover the last 3 months of 2013. I remind the community that the GED tests will be re-written starting January 1, 2014.

If you have taken 1 or more test(s), I encourage you to call (928-769-2200) or see me at the Hualapai Training Center to complete the 5 tests which are Science, Social Studies, Math, Writing and Reading.

If you have taken 1 or more test(s) and choose not to complete all 5, the test(s) you have taken will disappear starting January 1, 2014.

Our community has seen 6 individuals receive their GED!!!! Join this group of individuals in our community, who were successful in their education!

I offer my help so you can finish your studies for a GED test(s). Class is held Monday - Friday 1:00 - 4:00 p.m..

The General Education Diploma (GED) will go through changes starting January 2014.

- All tests will be taken on a computer at Mohave Community College.
- The tests will reflect what a Senior in High School is required to know for graduation.
- The testing fee will increase. At this time, there is no dollar amount to pass on for information. A student will need to pass the following subjects with a score of at least **410**.

Science
Social Studies
Math
Reading
Writing

With all 5 tests, you need to have an average of **450**.

An example is a student receives the following scores on the 5 tests:

Science	470
Social Studies	460
Math	430
Reading	450
Writing	450

The students' total score equals 2,260. The total 2,260 is divided by 5 tests and the average equals 452. This shows that each test was passed as the student received over the **410** required for each test and the average is over the **450** for all 5 tests.

Another example that is important:

If a student has passed 3 of the 5 tests and chooses not to continue taking the 2 remaining tests in January 2014, the 3 tests this student passed will disappear AND the student will have to start taking all 5 tests again in 2014.

- If you are an enrolled Hualapai tribal members, the Training Center has funds to pay for the test fee.





Let's Get Rid of Head Lice!



Did you know you can eliminate head lice with olive oil?

Did you know if you interrupt the life cycle of head lice, you can get rid of them?

A simple method of applying olive oil or any cooking oil to dry hair and scalp, leaving it in for 4-6 hours, then combing out the dead lice and nits can be the answer to being lice free!

*To be the most successful at this program, you should use the oil treatment every 4 days for a total of 6 treatments. This means you apply generous amounts of olive oil to the scalp and massage it in. Saturate the scalp and leave it in for 4-6 hours. Then using a **METAL** lice comb, comb out the dead lice and nits while the oil is still in the hair. Wash, rinse and comb out the hair again. Once the hair is dry, inspect for lice and nits. Remember to clean the comb by swiping it on a wet paper towel to remove debris on each combing. Comb out small sections at a time for best results!*

Important Reminders:

- Appointments are scheduled in 20-minute time slots, so please arrive at least 20 minutes early for your appointment. If you are 10 minutes late, you will have to reschedule.
- Call the medical (769-2920) or dental (769-2903) appointment lines to schedule or cancel your next appointment. Call the Pharmacy (769-2992) for medication questions or refills.
- Most outside prescriptions may be filled by the Pharmacy. If the Pharmacy has the prescription in stock, it will be filled directly by the Pharmacist. Otherwise, they will be reviewed and approved by an IHS Physician and then entered into your Electronic Health Record (EHR). In this case, prescriptions CANNOT be filled without an order in the EHR from the Physician. This process may take some time, we appreciate your patience.
- 72-Hour notification to Contract Health is required for emergency treatment or admission at a non-IHS facility.
- All non-emergent, private health care or specialty services require prior authorization FOR EACH VISIT from CHS.
