The Tribe received some encouraging news earlier this week and I wanted to make sure you were aware.


The U.S. Supreme Court refused to hear arguments from Grand Canyon Skywalk Development in one of that company's ongoing lawsuits against the Tribe. The company's attorneys were appealing an earlier ruling to the Supreme Court in Washington D.C., but the justices would not hear their arguments and essentially reinforced what the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court of Appeals had already ruled. Put simply, this ends the lawsuit and forces GCSD's attorneys to bring their case to Tribal Court - exactly where it belonged in the first place.

I'm very happy about this news and what it means for our community. The U.S. Supreme Court has reinforced the sovereignty of the Hualapai Tribe and the Tribal Court system. Much like our system of justice, there are Tribal Courts across the country that are fair and impartial venues to resolve disputes. I am grateful to federal judges who, throughout this process, have supported our inherent rights as a sovereign nation.

The U.S. Supreme Court's refusal to hear these arguments is another victory for the Hualapai Tribe and an important moment as we work to resolve this unfortunate situation. I'm proud of our community and ask that you remain focused on what matters: the future of the Hualapai people.



- You represent a college, tribe or other organization that works with Native American college students in Natural Resources fields.

*Hiring Season is almost here*

1. All hiring for Pathways Permanent Intern and Temporary Intern programs is now done through USA-Jobs. You should immediately go to [www.usajobs.com](http://www.usajobs.com) and establish an account. Once your account is set up and your resume is posted online, it will be quick and easy for you to apply for any job announcement. Check USAJobs often for new job announcements for summer 2014.
2. Announcements for permanent and summer temporary intern positions with the US Forest Service are posted on USAJobs now. Apply for the jobs that interest you and are in your field of study. If you are Native American, please self-identify on your application. You need to apply for these jobs IMMEDIATELY – like this week.
3. Announcements for permanent and summer temporary intern positions with the Bureau of Indian Affairs will be posted on USAJobs starting in December. Remember that the BIA uses “Indian Preference” in its hiring process. If you are NOT Native American, you might consider other government agencies – BIA only hires non-natives if a qualified Native American applicant is not available.

## **ABOR Approves Revision to Residency Policy for Enrolled Members of Arizona Tribes**

*Changes go into effect beginning spring 2014*

(Phoenix, AZ) – Students who are enrolled members of one of the sovereign Arizona federally-recognized tribes now will be eligible for in-state tuition at Arizona’s three state universities as a result of recently approved residency policy changes by the Arizona Board of Regents (ABOR).

The policy revision goes into effect the spring semester of 2014.

This revision also provides an incentive for American Indian students from one of Arizona’s federally recognized tribes who attend out-of-state colleges to return to Arizona to complete a bachelor’s degree. Approximately 4,200 American Indian students currently attend one of Arizona’s state universities either as an undergraduate or graduate student.

More than 35 tribal colleges exist in at least 13 states. These largely two-year institutions attract many Arizona Native American students who will consider transferring to four-year universities. Previously, ABOR residency classification policy would have prevented these students from being considered for in-state tuition, and prompting many of these students to remain in the state of the tribal college.

“Due to lack of infrastructure and jobs, many Arizona tribal members move off-reservation to work and attend school,” said Regent LuAnn Leonard, executive director of the Hopi Education Endowment Fund. “By approving these policy changes, the Board acknowledged this reality for Arizona tribes while ensuring that students who have been moved away know that our universities are working to welcome them back home.”

The policy revision is not retroactive to previous semesters. Continuing students who have been classified as non-residents must contact the residency office to change their residency classification.

“This is excellent news for Arizona’s Native American communities and our three universities,” said ABOR President Eileen Klein. “The Board is committed to student success and this policy revision is reflective of that commitment and the Board’s recognition of the higher education needs of the Arizona American Indian tribes.”

The revised policy states: “For purposes of residency classification, enrollment as a tribal member in a federally recognized Arizona tribe will be sufficient to establish residency for tuition purposes.” ([ABOR Policy 4-203 C. 8](#)) To be eligible for in-state tuition under this revision: 1) the student must provide proof of being an enrolled tribal member; 2) the tribe must be one of Arizona’s federally-recognized tribes, and 3) the student must be a U.S. citizen, OR a lawful permanent resident of the U.S., OR have lawful immigration status in the U.S. ([ABOR Policy 4-102](#)).

“I commend the Board of Regents for taking this important step that encourages Arizona’s American Indian students who have moved away to return to our state to further their education,” said John R. Lewis, executive director, Intertribal Council of Arizona. “Ultimately, it will aid in strengthening workforce development and diversity for our state.”

### RECENT CHANGES TO ABOR RESIDENCY POLICY FOR ENROLLED MEMBERS OF ARIZONA TRIBES

Beginning with the spring semester of 2014, any student who is an enrolled member of one of Arizona's federally recognized tribes may be eligible to receive in-state tuition at ASU, NAU and UA.

1. What is the revised policy?
  - a. The revised policy says: "For purposes of residency classification, enrollment as a tribal member in a federally recognized Arizona tribe will be sufficient to establish residency for tuition purposes." (ABOR Policy 4-203 B. 8)
  - b. To be eligible for in-state tuition under this revision, a student must:
    - i. provide proof of being an enrolled tribal member, and
    - ii. the tribe must be one of Arizona's federally-recognized tribes, and
    - iii. the student must be a U.S. citizen, OR a lawful permanent resident of the U.S., OR have lawful immigration status in the U.S. (ABOR Policy 4-102)
  
2. When does the revised policy go into effect?
  - a. The policy is effective beginning with spring semester 2014.
  - b. The policy is NOT retroactive to previous semesters.
  - c. **CONTINUING STUDENTS WHO HAVE BEEN CLASSIFIED AS NON-RESIDENTS MUST CONTACT THE RESIDENCY OFFICE TO CHANGE THEIR RESIDENCY CLASSIFICATION (This is also called a Petition to change Domicile Classification.).**
    - i. Changes are not automatic
    - ii. Changes must be made by the university's deadline

    - ii. if the student is a member of an Indian tribe recognized by the United States Department of Interior whose reservation land lies in this state and extends into another state and who is a resident of the reservation. (ABOR Policy 4-203 B. 8), OR
    - iii. if the person is domiciled within 75 miles of the Arizona border in Clark County, Nevada or Washington or Kane Counties, Utah, or in San Bernardino, Imperial, or Riverside Counties in California, including the cities of Needles, Blythe, El Centro, Brawley, and Winter Haven, and is enrolling in a total of no more than 6 credit hours per semester offered in Mohave, La Paz, or Yuma Counties, Arizona by Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University, or the University of Arizona or the person is domiciled within 75 miles of the Arizona border in Grant, Hidalgo, or Luna Counties in New Mexico and is enrolling in a total of no more than 6 credit hours per semester offered in Cochise County, Arizona by Arizona

State University, Northern Arizona University, or the University of Arizona.

- d. To be eligible for in-state tuition under any ABOR policy, the student must be a U.S. citizen, OR a lawful permanent resident of the U.S., OR have lawful immigration status in the U.S. (ABOR Policy 4-102).


