## HUALAPAI ELDER GROUP HOME

Over two dozen people attended the house warming and blessing for the new Elder Group Home on December 17th. The new residential building has eight bedrooms and over 4,500 square feet of living area for up to 16 people, plus an enclosed back patio and ten parking spaces. The building is located at 533 Juniper Street, just north of the Indian Health Services parking lot and one block east of the Senior Center.

The project began in 2010 with the award of a HUD-Indian Community Development Block Grant. The group home is unique in that it is based off of The Green House Project, a model for small groups of elders to live safely and independently, not in a clinic or nursing facility. Selberg and Associates designed the building with the aid of a steering committee comprised of Elders. Woodruff Construction began work on the site in late April and will be adding the finishing touches through the first week of January 2015. ## ELDER GROUP HOME APPLICATION



The Elder Group Home is based on The Green House Project, a model for small groups of elders to live safely and independently, not in a clinic or a nursing facility. The 4,600 square foot building has enough room for 16 people living in eight bedrooms who share kitchen, dining, laundry and living areas. Residences will be responsible for preparing their own meals, doing their own laundry, keeping up their rooms and paying for their own telephone service. Other utilities costs will be paid for by the Hualapai Tribe. The monthly rent is set at \$200.00 for individuals and \$300.00 for couples. Single occupants may be asked to share a room. A one year lease is standard.

I would like to give my community a update on the Green Reentry Program. It has been a busy few months. I am learning something new about the program every day. There has been some reporting to the Office of Juvenile and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) on youth in the program. As many of you know I have applied for a no-cost extension grant to keep the program going for another year. I was approved. With the monies that were awarded I plan to use it to help sustain the program after the grant ends. This includes maintenance repair on the green houses. I have been working hard on getting our youth in some kind of schooling. A few attend Primavera online and others attend public schooling. I feel that education is very important for our youth especially finishing high school. At times it can be challenging but I feel that with motivation and dedication they can succeed in what they do. As a community I feel that we have some positive things going on. I am happy to see your community come together for certain holiday events, community awareness workshops, and positive activities for the youth as well as for adults. When I can I encourage my youth to attend these functions, to get involved with their community, and take advantage of what we have here. I can recall one event where I took a youth to help serve at a community event, this particular youth is a little shy around crowds, but I encouraged the youth, that it would be "ok", and to take a few plates to elders sitting down, before the night was over the youth was having a blast. It was a good feeling seeing this youth out there, mingling, and the community seeing that there is more to these kids. I also try to have at least one outing a month for the youth. In September we went to the both the Powerhouse and Mohave Museums in Kingman as well as the Fort Beal site. In October we went to the Heard Museum in Phoenix, Arizona. In November they youth were able to tour the Lowell Observatory in Flagstaff. The youth enjoy these trips as it gets them away to explore things outside of where they live. The youth have good qualities and simply need encouragement and a helping hand and as a community I feel we can do that. I enjoy being a part of the Green Reentry program and more importantly I enjoy helping the youth in our community. If you have any ideas or recommendations please don't hesitate to give me holler. I'd like to also thank the community for their support and encouraging words, they mean a lot. Have a wonderful New Year!

During the month of September the youth were very busy going out to the country to cut wood for the elderly wood program, once the wood was brought back the youth split it and delivered it to the elders that we have on file here at the facility, The youth also had a big part in preparing food for the annual tribal employee's picnic. In October the youth continued with the wood program then as a reward for the hard work the youth got to go to phoenix to heard museum and then to the Rob Zombie's Great American Scare haunted house. During November the youth had a hand in helping prepare and serve for the veteran's day dinner as well as the community Thanksgiving dinner, along with these activities the youth continued to help with cutting wood for the elders. We were able to reward the youth for their hard work by taking them to the observatory in Flagstaff which they enjoyed very much followed by a movie. Finally during the first part of this month (DEC) the youth were helping with delivering wood to our elders and stacking it for them. We were fortunate to do these activities with the youth despite the busy schedule they already have with school work and programming. I am glad to be a part of this program where the youth get to give back to the community.



The 2015 SWIAF Fashion Show is a new component in its second year. The designers will be considered artists and performers for SWIAF. The designers will be reviewed by a committee of five (5) judges. The winner for each category will be awarded a space at SWIAF's new 'Fashion Row' section to display and sell merchandise, in addition to a \$100 cash prize.

### Information and Eligibility Criteria

Collaborative designs are allowed and are defined as art/designs created by two or more individuals. Each individual artist must complete a separate application and meet all eligibility criteria.

Eligibility criteria: Must have tribal affiliation and/or be registered with a federally recognized tribe.

Four Categories (description):

All work must be Indian-made and is subject to evaluation by SWIAF Fashion Committee members. "All products must be marketed truthfully regarding the Indian heritage and tribal affiliation of the producers, so as not to mislead the consumer" as per the [Indian Arts and Craft Act of 1990](#). See [SWIAF's Policies and Procedures](#) for more information.

- **Traditional:** Clothing that reflects traditional Southwest Native culture and/or is inspired by pow-wow regalia.
- **Contemporary:** Clothing inspired by Southwest Native culture, but fused with modern high fashion trends.
- **Streetwear:** Clothing that reflects ever-evolving street culture.
- **Accessories:** Items that complement outfits including beadwork, handcrafted moccasins, hats, jewelry (couture Native pop, traditional), purses, scarves, and shoes. Must meet [SWIAF's Rules of Participation for Artist](#).
