## Walapai Market 76 Gas Station Open for Business

After over ten years without a public gas station on the Hualapai Reservation, a new 76 station opened in downtown Peach Springs on Monday morning. The fuel station is operated by the Walapai Market and is located behind the building just off of Diamond Creek Road. The fuel station's two dispensers, which can serve four automobiles, features three grades of gasoline: 87, 89 and 91 octane as well as Diesel fuel and at a much more reasonable price than any public gas

station within 40 miles of the facility. Customers may pay at the pump with a credit or debit card or inside the store with cash. Conoco/Phillips/76 credit card applications are available at the store and cardholders receive a five cent per gallon discount when they purchase fuel with the card.

The Tribe would like to extend its appreciation to Rav Sandhu, Site Superintendent and Matt Ringer, Project Manager for AR Mays in getting the project built within the contract period and staying within budget. Store customers and patrons of Robin's Salon are encouraged to park in one of the 20 new parking spaces behind the building.

The final touches on the market project coming in the next few weeks are landscaping rock for the entrance area and signage for both the interior and exterior of the building, including a monument sign along Route 66 which will display the name of the Walapai Market and fuel prices and logo for the 76 gas station.

## Public Comments Requested

Local and Regional Hazard Mitigation plans are required to be updated every 5 years. FEMA requires a Tribe to have a current approved plan, in order to receive grant funding through mitigation grants.

The current Hualapai Tribe Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan was last prepared in August 2004 by the Hualapai Natural Resources Department. Mohave County's Multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan was last prepared in 2010.

The Hualapai Tribe would like the public to review and comment, on the current Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan. In addition, Mohave County has invited the Hualapai Tribe to participate in the update of the Mohave County Multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

A copy of the current Hualapai Tribe Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan and Mohave County's Multi-Jurisdictional Plan are being made available for review. The existing plans will be accessible at the following locations:


