



This year I was given the task and honor of creating an award on behalf of The Hualapai Adult Detention Center, to symbolize leadership and to commemorate a Hualapai Tribal Member with Great Leadership skills.

On May 28, 2015 I contacted Samuel Bender Jr. to request for his permission to create and name our award in his honor. This award is titled "Gy. Sgt. Samuel Bender Jr. Award" with this award Mr. Bender presented us with a quote to place on the award which states,

"Leadership is a trait that few possess. Setting the example, doing the right thing, sacrifice and Inspiring others to lead are characteristics of a great leader. Great leaders create successful teams."

Samuel Bender Jr. was selected because as a child growing up on the Hualapai Indian Reservation and having to deal with the struggles of Reservation life; Alcoholism, Drugs, Domestic Violence, Etc. He was one of the few Native Americans to push forward and make something for himself. As many of you know, Mr. Bender served The United States Marine Corps for 17 years and was deployed to several locations throughout the world; through all that God has kept him and his family safe and he's returned home to work for the Grand Canyon Resort Corporation. I believe that Mr. Bender is an inspiration to all Native American people.

These individuals were selected to receive this award by Director Angela Chavez after one (1) week of leadership training. During the training they displayed outstanding leadership skills; which consist of teamwork, communication, dedication, determination and knowing one's self.

This award will be given out annually in Showlow, AZ during the Leadership Retreat hosted by Conditioned Response Training LLC. Each individual selected to receive this award will be given a certificate with the middle photo below and a copy of Mr. Bender's biography.



To Parents, guardians and Community members,

Peach Springs School District is nearing a new fiscal year, and as the new District CEO, I would like to share how I envision aligning strategies and evolving structural changes for solutions to meet challenges that impede improvements in educational performance.

Over the past few days, I have listened to many opinions from the leaders, parents, school staff, and other community members. The ideas are valid, valuable, and it provides the seeds for actions directed towards school improvement. Personally, my philosophy is rooted in children-first and my critical thinking and associated pragmatic actions come from my commitment to the child-first thinking. For example, in the core of the critical child-first philosophy, the parents become equal primary stakeholders engaging in active roles throughout the year. The school district is the other primary stakeholder charged with professional education services without thought of failure and further obligated to teaching under a burden of higher accountability. A common ideal held very high by parents and teachers include an aspiration to achieve more. To move to this aspiration, we must reflect inwards to find solutions for action. Our activities must lead to educational improvements that we can quantify, and connect to the future of the Hualapai Nation. This means providing the highest level of instructions, and coming forth holding an ambitious attitude in paraphrasing JFK, we should not be asking, "What can the school do for me", but ask, "What can I do for the school". Here are a few guiding points:

- Integrate tribal programs into our education services
- Build bridges throughout the whole community until we see and agree on common goals
- We will never give up on a single child, every child will succeed
- Structure equality in task actions that rely on more than one person
- Become an NCA school in two years
- A goal to have all children in K-4 reading at grade level within two school calendar years
- A goal to develop highly competent class management strategies with engaging lessons throughout the day, the entire school year to avoid sending students into detention.

In pursuing these points, I will put in-place accountability based on structure that will align with our capabilities, and ultimately deliver improved services to our students at a more rapid pace. In the next few weeks, with community and parental input; I will decide how to organize the roles and how we will work together in concert to deliver the highest level of instructions possible.

Any reorientation of internal human resource structure will come forth targeting the accommodation of our community and the desired Native American cultural values. Management will rely heavily on the parents and the community. This means a new "code of conduct" for employees and integrating cultural values into standardize curriculum. This will require everyone to engage in extra time to do research and prepare engaging "best practice" lessons. If students are engaged in learning, there is a strong potential of reducing behavioral problems and refocusing our students in learning.

Toning our structure to our strategy will place our school in a strong position to help contribute in building a powerful Hualapai Nation and allow the self-determination to create the finest community that humanity can offer. From my experience in the Native American communities, I can unequivocally attest that the children have greater or equal to any people on the planet so it's incumbent upon us to provide the best educational services possible.





