GUARDIANSHIP

BE IT ENACTED by the Hualapai Tribal Council Meeting in regular session at Peach Springs, Arizona, this 5th day of January 1962, that Ordinance No. 12 be adopted containing provisions for Curfew Hours and shall become Chapter 14 of the Hualapai Law and Order Code approved October 17, 1959 by the Hualapai Tribal Council:

It shall become unlawful on and after the 16th day of January 1962, between the hours of ten O'clock p.m. and six O'clock a.m. for any child under the age of 16 years to be found upon the streets, public places, alley-ways, thorough fares, picture shows, playgrounds within the boundary limits of the town of Peach Springs, Hualapai Indian Reservation, Arizona, unless such child is accompanied or personally supervised at the time by the parent or other adult person entrusted with his or her custody.

Any person who allows, or through neglect causes his or her child or any child under his or her custody 16 years of age and under to violate this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof shall be sentenced to hard labor for a period not to exceed ten days or to pay a fine not to exceed ten dollars.

Any Child who violates any law, ordinance or regulation of the Hualapai Tribe will be placed in the custody of the Hualapai Tribal Court for hearing and disposition as is prescribed by Chapter 7 Juvenile Code of the Revised Ordinance No. 9 Civil and Criminal Law and Order Code of the Hualapai Tribe enacted October 17, 1959.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION

The foregoing Ordinance was duly adopted on January 5, 1962, by the Hualapai Tribal Council, by the affirmative vote of six members, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Section 1 (O), Article VI, of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Hualapai Tribe of the Hualapai Reservation, Arizona, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior _____, 19____ pursuant to Section 16, of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). This Ordinance shall be effective when approved by the Superintendent of Truxton Canon Subagency unless rescinded by the Secretary of the Interior within 90 days as provided by the Tribal Constitution.
