

Acceptance to the 2024 Hualapai Language Immersion Day Camp is a privilege, but it also requires students to assume certain responsibilities.

Tribal Member Names and Addresses

Our office is charged with maintaining current and accurate names and addresses of all tribal members: Hualapai Constitution, Article II. Our office has experienced delays in receiving name changes that may be the result of marriage, adoption or voluntarily changing of one's name.

The process in changing your name with the Enrollment Office is as follows:

- 1. Provide a marriage license, adoption decree or court order of name change;
- 2. Provide an updated Social Security Card with changed name;
- 3. Issuance of new tribal ID and CIB;
- 4. Any other questions, please contact our office.

Addresses are important for tribal members to frequently update with our office. Enrollment Office supplies that information for tribal events like Election seasons and distributions. This will greatly establish a database of up-to-date tribal member data.

Tribal Member Death

In the event of a death of a tribal member, please notify our office so we may inactivate their profile and once a death certificate is received, provide a copy to our office so we may officially close their tribal member file.

- 4. If a person appears to be under the influence or smell of alcohol, visitation will be denied.
- 5. All purses/bags must be left in your vehicle.
- 6. All visitors must be dressed appropriately.
- 7. No food, beverages, cell phones, cameras, containers or any other property is allowed in the visiting area.
- 8. If you have been incarcerated within the last 90 days, you will not be allowed visitation.
- 9. All visitors are subject to be searched.
- 10. Visits may be denied at any time; due to behavior of visitor(s) and/or inmate.
- 11. Visitors may be asked to leave the Facility in the event of an emergency or any other reasons not listed.
- 12. Visitation may be denied for the above reasons, but not limited to.

The Reservation is our horitage and the heritage of our children yet univers. Be good to our land and it will continue to be good to us.

The Sun is the symbol of life, without it nothing is possible – plants don't grow – there will be no life – nothing. The Sun also represents the dawn of the Bushapai people. Through hard work, determination and education, everything is possible and we are assured higger and brighter days ahead.

The Tracks in the middle represent the coyete and other animals which were here before us.

The Green around the symbol are pine trees, representing our name Hualsmai – PEOPLE OF THE TALL PINES –



In 1987 Chairman Edgar B Walema signed Resolution 21-87 which

was the development of the Tribal Action, PL 99-570; January 4, 1993 Delbert Havatone, Chairperson approved the implementation of a Tribal Action Plan; June 2, 2023 Chairwoman Sherry J Parker approved a continuing of the implementation of the approved Tribal Action Plan for a comprehensive Prevention and Treatment program for Alcoholism and other Substance Abuse.

To this date- the Hualapai Tribal Council has supported our Sobriety Awareness efforts to the Hualapai Indian Reservation and all the people who reside, work, and affiliate with the tribe.

Just when did our roots begin? I wish I had an answer for you. It would be amazing to know where our grass roots began and how we have made sobriety an annual event.

Planning meetings started in April 2024, David Dawley, HEW Director asked the Hualapai Council to fund the event and it was granted. Family activities, Horseshoes with cash payouts Friday and Saturday, Mountain biking with SDPI, sweat for men and women, AA meetings, Talking Circles, community men and women volunteered to speak about their experience on the Red Road. 


