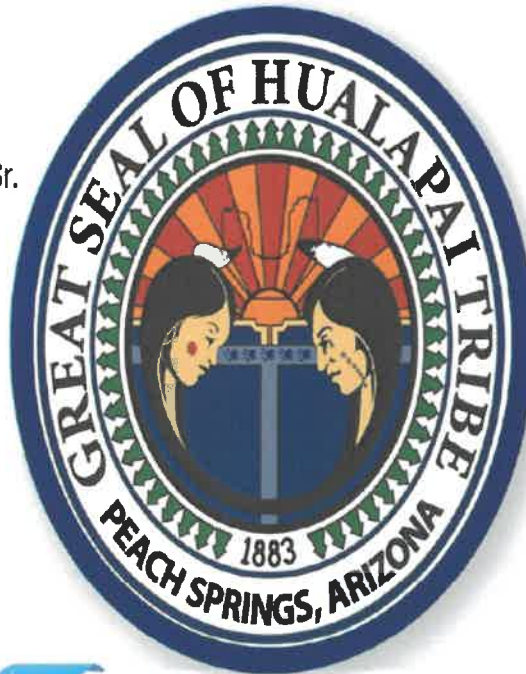

The recreational park is currently undergoing a multi-phased design and construction effort to deliver new recreation facilities. **The first phase will include the following infrastructure:**

1. All Visitors must provide some form of picture identification to the Officer(s) in exchange for a visitor pass.
2. Visitation with an Inmate is limited to 15 minutes (only 4 people allowed in the visitation room per visit).
3. No one under the age of 18 is allowed, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.
4. If a person appears to be under the influence or smell of alcohol, visitation will be denied.
5. All purses/bags must be left in your vehicle.
6. All visitors must be dressed appropriately.
7. No food, beverages, cell phones, cameras, containers or any other property is allowed in the visiting area.
8. If you have been incarcerated within the last 90 days, you will not be allowed visitation.
9. All visitors are subject to be searched.
10. Visits may be denied at any time; due to behavior of visitor(s) and/or inmate.
11. Visitors may be asked to leave the Facility in the event of an emergency or any other reasons not listed.
12. Visitation may be denied for the above reasons, but not limited to.

IF YOU ARE THE VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ANY TYPE OF COMMUNICATION/VISITATION WITH THE INMATE.

Tribal Member Names and Addresses

Our office is charged with maintaining current and accurate names and addresses of all tribal members; Hualapai Constitution, Article II. Our office has experienced delays in receiving name changes that may be the result of marriage, adoption or voluntarily changing of one's name.

The process in changing your name with the Enrollment Office is as follows:

1. Provide a marriage license, adoption decree or court order of name change;
2. Provide an updated Social Security Card with changed name;
3. Issuance of new tribal ID and CIB;
4. Any other questions, please contact our office.

Addresses are important for tribal members to frequently update with our office. Enrollment Office supplies that information for tribal events like Election seasons and distributions. This will greatly establish a database of up-to-date tribal member data.

Tribal Member Death

In the event of a death of a tribal member, please notify our office so we may inactivate their profile and once a death certificate is received, provide a copy to our office so we may officially close their tribal member file.

WASHINGTON — Eligible organizations providing employment-based resources and tools to help recently separated members of the Armed Forces and their spouses may now apply at <https://grants.gov/search-results-detail/348022> for grants from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Through this new program, VA is set to award approximately \$4 million in grants through its Veteran and Spouse Transitional Assistance Grant Program in 2024. Each grant will be in increments of up to \$500,000 and is to be matched by the grantee organization.

Priority preference will be given to applicants that either provide multiple services or are in a state with any one of these criteria:

- A high rate of unemployment among Veterans.
- A high rate of usage of unemployment benefits for recently separated members of the Armed Forces.
- A labor force or economy that has been significantly impacted by a covered public health emergency.

Key services offered by grantee organizations may include resume assistance, interview training, job recruitment training, employment placement services, employment education and training, and referrals to employment. "Organizations that provide transition services are critical to supporting our more than 200,000 men and women who leave U.S. military service every year. VA — in partnership with these organizations — aims to empower and provide Veterans and their spouses the necessary support to achieve their employment goals and build successful civilian lives following this critical transition period" said **Under Secretary for Benefits Joshua Jacobs**. "The Veteran and Spouse Transitional Assistance Grant Program underscores VA's commitment to honoring Veterans and their family's service and sacrifice, and we encourage eligible organizations to apply." Supporting Veterans and their families is a core pillar of President Biden's Unity Agenda for the nation. Since day one, the Biden-Harris Administration has focused on supporting an effective transition from military service to civilian life for Veterans and their spouses, including through expanded job training assistance. The Biden-Harris Administration and First Lady Jill Biden, through her Joining Forces initiative, continue to work to eliminate barriers to employment and increase economic opportunity for Veteran and military families.

This new grant program — the first-ever to be extended to military spouses — builds on the historic Executive Order signed by President Biden in 2023, which announced a series of new actions aimed at enhancing career stability, expanding employment resources, and improving transition assistance support for military-connected spouses.

VA offers additional services to help Veterans, transitioning service members, and spouses find and keep jobs through programs such as Personalized Career Planning and Guidance and Veteran Readiness and Employment. These programs provide career counseling, assessment, and education planning tailored to Veteran needs.

Organizations may apply at www.grants.gov. Applications will be accepted for a minimum of 30 days.

Veteran Benefits Counselors Now Offering Online Appointments

Veterans wanting to make an appointment with a Veterans Benefits Counselor (VBC) can now do so online via Calendly!

The new online system allows an alternative contact method to scheduling VBC appointments and will help eliminate double booking issues related to the VBC call center.

When a Veteran or client sets an appointment, it is automatically added to the VBC's calendar. Calendly will only show available slots on a VBC's calendar.

The new system will also send out four reminders-- two emails and two text messages-- prior to the appointment.

For those who don't wish to use the online system, they can still call the VBC appointment line and staff will be able to walk them through the process of setting up an appointment.

About the VBC program:

The Arizona Department of Veterans' Services has more than 50 VBCs statewide, dedicated to helping Veterans, service members and families navigate federal and state benefits.

ADVS VBCs bring in more than \$84 million per month in AV benefits for Arizona Veterans. "When Veterans come back into the civilian world, a lot of folks think you can roll right back in and have it together, but it is a transition. And that is where ADVS steps in to act as an advocate," said Gary Ochoa, ADVS Assistant Deputy Director of Veterans Services Division.

Our VBCs are all dual-accredited by the Department of Veterans Affairs and the American Legion.

Our VBCs work remotely across the state of Arizona and can also be found at our Veteran Homes.

An appointment with a VBC can be done virtually, in-person or via email.

Our VBCs help clients by:

- Educating them on eligibility requirements for benefits
- Preparing and submitting VA compensation and pension applications
- Appealing VA decisions
- Representing claimants at VA hearings
- Preparing and submitting survivor benefits applications
- Applying for discharge upgrades
- Referring claimants to other agencies for potential benefits
- Requesting military service records and certifying DD-214s (discharge paperwork)
- Discussing State Veteran Benefits
